ORDER DENYING AS MOOT DEFENDANT'S MOTION TO COMPEL

Defendant Ronald H. Van Den Heuvel has moved this Court for an order compelling the United States to turn over the contents of a USB flash drive that Mr. Van Den Heuvel's former accountant provided to the government. The United States has averred that it mailed a copy of the flash drive's contents to Mr. Van Den Heuvel on July 13, 2017. *See* United States' Response to Defendant Ronald Van Den Heuvel's Motion to Compel Discovery, ECF No. 117. Accordingly, Mr. Van Den Heuvel's motion will be denied as moot.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Ronald H. Van Den Heuvel's Motion to Compel Discovery, ECF No. 96, is **DENIED as moot**.

Your attention is directed to 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1)(A), Fed. R. Crim. P. 59(a), and E.D. Wis. Gen. L. R. 72(c), whereby written objections to any order herein, or part thereof, may be filed within fourteen days of service of this Order or prior to the Final Pretrial Conference, whichever is earlier. Objections are to be filed in

accordance with the Eastern District of Wisconsin's electronic case filing procedures. Failure to file a timely objection with the district judge shall result in a waiver of a party's right to appeal. If no response or reply will be filed, please notify the Court in writing.
