RE: Unidentified bodies buried Mounded Knee vicinity.

On Jume 28-29, 1973 the undersigned proceeded to the Vounded Mnee, South Dakota area in an effort to locate the alleged site of eight graves in this area.

Prior arrangements had been made to meet an informant identity unknown to this author.

The undersigned arrived at Wounded Knee at approximately 5:30 AM and proceeded to the reported grave site area where the informant had been told to meet the undersigned at this hour. Upon arrival it was determined that the informant was not in the pre-designated location.

Thinking that the informant had been delayed and wishing to make the best possible use of available time at the alleged scene of the crime, the undersigned proceeded to search for further evidence of foul play in this area and/or graves described by the informant.

Found in this area and photographed in the original position were several articles believed to have been provisions being carried to Wounded Knee during the occupation.

Prior to the above, a pack complete with food and clothes and also containing a Rapid City newspaper dated April 26, 1973, had been found at this scene by the undersigned. All of this material has been brought to the Legal Office, Rapid City, S. D., appropriately marked and booked as evidence.

Also found at this time was an Army issue Muset Pag containing supplies and a large quanity of reddish-brown stain thought by the undersigned to be possibly blood stains.

It is felt by the undersigned that it is imperitive that this had be processed by a labratory in order to determine if, in fact, the above atains are blood.

Due to a lack of private facilities in Rapid City for this type of testing, the undersigned are in the process of arranging for tests to be run at the Institute of Forensic Sciences, Oakland, California, by Mr. ED MILLER, Criminoligist. The findings of these tests will be submitted as obtained from the labratory.
