I send 7 it to the Oneida Enrollment Office to verify the signatures, and then I submit it to the Business 8 Committee at one of their duly called regular 9 meetings, and then they take action to accept it 10 11 and then send it for analysis.

12 Generally we get a legal and a 13 legislative and a fiscal analysis completed.

Once that is returned, then we determine whether
the petition will go forward to a date for a GTC
meeting, a General Tribal Council meeting.
