Dear JoAnn,

On Page 57 of 84 of your Legal Analysis on Madeline's Petition regarding 7 Gens, you say in the last para.,

"A second grant was submitted in order to complete the project, and Oneida seven generations has received approval of a loan guarantee by the DOI to construct the building for the business. In the interim, 7 gens began finalizing the approval to lease the necessary land from the Tribe and obtain agreements for the transportation of local garbage for the waste to energy projects."

My concern is a March 7th memorandum from Mr. Philip Viles from the BIA to a Tribal member who is keeping on top of this issue. In his memorandum, he says "The 'biomass money' as you call it is an offer from this office to guarantee a \$19 million loan from Dougherty to OSGC if the parties reach a deal that met our parameters. This has yet to happen."

Accordingly, either the BIA has funded the project since March 7th, or the analysis may need to be changed. Also, if the analysis is incorrect, who is providing our Law Office with incorrect information?
