I worked as a CNA for over 20 yrs. Richard attended school then went off to boarding school, he wasn't there long before I got a call he was having problems with depression & it was best he return home. He had no brother's or sister's at that time and seemed withdrawn, he wasn't the same after the boarding school sent him home. My oldest daughter and her husband helped alot by taking him on fishing trips, he would spend weekends with them, they bought him clothes, I guess we were trying to protect him & keep him happy. I don't know how he got involved with drugs but I noticed some of his cousins started coming around, they started showing an interest in him & would pick him up on different occasions, they seemed to have some influence over him, much peer pressure and he was trying to fit in. These people were Ruben Ortiz & his gang, they are 3rd cousins & I heard a lot of things about them. Richard managed to hold a job in construction, he was gaining experience and worked long hours. He still spent most weekends with his daughters at my apt. we did a lot of cooking together, he took the kids to the parks and watched movies. Richard's background doesn't look good but he's a good person, he told me the 1st time he used & the strong affect it had

on him, he had developed a habit he had no control over - he changed in so many ways, becoming restless + depressed, losing his straight decent friends, seemed to be sleeping a lot when here with me + going downhill. I hope you understand how hard it is to watch someone you love get so destroyed by this terrible drug, it has affected the whole family, however I feel he still has some good left in him that will help him on the right path after he is released from prison.
