

I, Officer E. Rosenau, was on full uniformed patrol working as 3B1 for the Green Bay Police Department. At approximately 2236 hours, officers were dispatched to the intersection of S. Military Avenue and Mason Street for the report of a hit and run accident. Dispatch notes indicated that a van was speeding, ran a light, and hit a vehicle. The run vehicle was described as a black minivan with an unknown plate. I was not far from the accident so I added myself.

Upon arrival, I observed a black pickup truck parked on Mason Street facing eastbound east of S. Military with its hazards on. I activated my emergency lights and positioned my squad behind the vehicle and asked the driver if he was okay and to provide identification. He provided me a Honduras identification card, and he was identified as RN. I then returned to my squad car. At this time, Officer Delwiche advised that he was out with the vehicle that fled the scene at the dead end on 6th Street. I asked RN if he could move his truck into the parking lot of the CVS Pharmacy at the intersection. He stated that he could and moved the vehicle into the parking lot. I then responded to meet with Officer Delwiche at the dead end of 6th Street. He had advised that the driver was possibly under the influence.

2, Complainant's review of the reports of Officer Delwiche of the Green Bay Police Department, who indicates that on November 12, 2022, at approximately 10:36 P.M. in the City of Green Bay, Brown County, Wisconsin:

I Officer Delwiche was working in full duty uniform for the City of Green Bay Police Department when i was dispatched to a vehicle accident at the intersection of Mason street and S Military Avenue. I was nearby when the accident was first dispatched and arrived only several minutes later to find a truck parked on Mason Street just to the east of the intersection. The male appeared to be uninjured and by this point the accident was reported as a hit and run with the run vehicle reported as a black minivan last seen driving behind the old Arby's restaurant. I checked the area of Mason Street and Irvington Street and found a black line in the road that appeared to be from a vehicle dragging something down the road. I followed this line southbound on Irvington until the line continued westbound on 6th street. I then located a black 2019 Dodge Grand Caravan bearing WI license plate "VILLEN" with substantial front end damage. There was a female in a light colored coat walking near the van and no other people were seen nearby.

I exited my patrol vehicle and immediately noticed that the female was swaying slightly and appeared to have trouble staying on her feet. I asked the female if she had been drinking and she responded "yes," due to the females lack of balance, I asked her to have a seat on the curb. I asked the female who was identified by WI ID as Rhiannon R Metoxen (01/13/1981), the defendant, how much she had to drink and she said "a few." When asked about the accident, Rhiannon exclaimed that she had "fucked up." I asked Rhiannon what way she driving during the accident and she was unable to tell me. By this time I could tell that Rhiannon was slurring her speech and was unable to remember aspects of an accident that had just occurred. I requested an additional unit to respond to my location. Rhiannon explained that she was coming from C Street bar in Green Bay and that was where she was last drinking. Due to Rhiannon's behavior, I suspected that she was under the influence of alcohol or drugs and I asked if she would be willing to undergo field sobriety testing to which she answered yes. I also noticed a wet spot on the front side of Rhiannon pants between her legs that appeared to be from her urinating herself.

I later observed damage to the front end of the Grand Caravan caused the passenger side front wheel to become bent and the vehicle seemed to be mostly disabled. It is unknown how much damage was from the initial accident and what was caused by Rhiannon continuing to drive.

On 11/20/2022 at approximately 1520 hours, I Officer Delwiche completed follow up for the attached case. I met with a witness to a hit and run accident that occurred on 11/12/2022 at the intersection of W Mason Street and S Military Avenue in Green Bay. The witness was verbally identified previously as OM and she previously agreed to meet at the Green Bay Police Department to speak to me about what she witnessed.

OM explained that at around 2245 hours on 11/12/2022 she was traveling westbound on W Mason Street, when she observed a black minivan which she noticed was bearing the license plate "Villein" or "Villien," following very closely behind her. OM stated that the minivan ran through a red light at the intersection of W Mason and S Fisk Street and was also swerving between lanes as it was driving. OM then came upon an accident at the intersection of W Mason and S Military Avenue and noticed the black minivan had front end damaged and was parked in a nearby parking lot. While OM was leaving the scene, she noticed the black minivan leave its parking lot and drive southbound on Irvington Street. OM was positive that this was the same minivan that she had noticed earlier.

Complainant believes the reports of Officer Rosenau and Officer Delwiche because he has relied on their reports in the past and has found them to be accurate.
